

You too can Haiku!

What's a haiku?

- Haiku is a very short form of Japanese poetry. The main idea of it is to contrast two images or ideas, with a 'cutting' word between them.
- Traditional haiku (5-7-5) often takes a form of three lines of set syllables.
- The first and last lines have five syllables, while the middle line has seven syllables.

Try counting the syllables in these 2 examples:

EVERYTHING AROUND
HERE IS RADIOACTIVE
EVEN YOUR TEACHER

TODAY I AM NOT
IN THE MOOD FOR POETRY
I JUST WANT TO EAT
